Most people I talk to have heard of the Paluxy River Children's Advocacy Center and know that we do good work for children but then will continue on to ask what exactly do we do? People often confuse us with other organizations such as CASA, which is a great organization but very different from ours. The Paluxy River Children's Advocacy Center (PRCAC) was established to create a safe, child friendly environment where a child who has been sexually or physically abused can tell their story one time. Prior to a Children's Advocacy Center, it was possible that children might have to tell their story multiple times to different institutions, which can be very traumatizing.

These newsletters will introduce you to the many programs we offer children and families in the community. In future editions of our newsletter, we will introduce you to our team of forensic interviewers, family advocates, education and outreach specialists, and clinical counselors. We are fortunate to have a committed, passionate team of professionals whose mission it is to provide healing services to children who have been sexually or physically abused.

In our facilities we have walls covered with hand prints of children we have interviewed and a rock garden full of hand painted rocks representing the children who have completed counseling. CATFISH COPS



Catfish Cops is a podcast hosted by Tony Godwin and Brandon Poor, both current Law Enforcement Detectives with large metropolitan police agencies in North Texas. With over 40 years of cumulative experience, the last 17 years of which were specifically in the area of online child exploitation, Tony and Brandon specialize in criminal investigations that deal primarily with Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC).

On April 11th, Brandon Poor of the Catfish Cops Podcast provided community members, parents, child-serving organizations, and MDT members with free training on internet safety. He stated in his presentation, "We cannot arrest our way out of this (internet crimes against children). Prevention, education, and awareness is the only way we can stop this crime." For privacy purposes, Brandon asked for his face to be covered.



STOP THE SILENCE RALLY

April 16th the Center participated in the Stop the Silence Rally in Stephenville. This is an annual awareness rally for crime victims including child abuse, sexual assault, domestic violence, and other violent crimes in our community. The hope is to stop the stigma of silence surrounding crime and link arms to show how our community supports survivors.



Our volunteers provide a variety of support for our agency including staffing our agency information booth at health fairs, assisting with Child Abuse Prevention Month activities, helping with fundraisers such as Heroes with Handbags, and providing support at other activities that support the agency. Events can be during the week, after hours, or on weekend depending on the specific activity.
